Information on the processing of personal data

3. Purposes and legal basis for the processing of personal data

Carrying out school entry medicals

Your contact details are collected so that we can invite you and your child to the (reformed) School Entry Medical and ensure that your child undergoes the medical.

The data relating to the examination by the public health office is collected and processed on the basis of Article 6 (1) c) GDPR in conjunction with Article 80 of the Bavarian Act on Education and Teaching (*Bayerisches Gesetz über das Erziehungs- and Unterrichtswesen – BayEUG*), Article 14 of the German Act on the Health Service and Consumer Protection (*Gesundheitsdienst- und Verbraucherschutzgesetz – GDVG*), Articles 20 and 34 of the German Infection Protection Act (*Infektionsschutzgesetz – IfSG*) and Article 27 of the Bavarian Declaration Data Regulation (*Meldedatenverordnung – MeldDV*).

After being collected, the data is stored by the public health office as long as is necessary to perform the respective tasks in connection with school healthcare, in compliance with the statutory retention periods under the Professional Code of Conduct for Doctors Working in Germany (MBO-Ä 1997). The data is erased when the statutory retention period ends. There is no legal entitlement to earlier erasure.

4. Recipients of personal data

- a) If the school entry medical required under Article 14 (5) GDVG in conjunction with Article 80 BayEUG is entirely or partially refused, a notification is submitted to the competent youth welfare office specifying the name, address and date of birth of the child, as well as the reason for notifying the youth welfare office. The legal basis for the data transmission arises from Article 5 (1) Clause 1 No. 1 GDPR in conjunction with the above-mentioned regulations.
- b) Pursuant to Article 14 (5) GDVG, the school management of the school where compulsory education is provided or is to be provided will be informed in writing, after the parent/guardian has been questioned, of any need to attend a German language preliminary course, any findings indicating a need for individual educational support and any illnesses that may necessitate a direct medical intervention or medical measures at the school. For that purpose, besides the required information, the surname, given name, address, date of birth of the child and examination date are transmitted. The legal basis for the data transmission arises from Article 5 (1) Clause 1 No. 1 GDPR in conjunction with the above-mentioned regulations.
- c) The transmission of the data by the public health office to the State Office for Health and Food Safety (*Landesamt für Gesundheit und Lebensmittelsicherheit LGL*) and the evaluation thereof by the LGL occurs in accordance with Article 11 of the Bavarian School Healthcare Regulation (*Schulgesundheitspflegeverordnung SchulgespflV*). The LGL receives that data without any personal reference, i.e. it is numbered only and a name and address are not

specified. Socio-demographic information is transmitted to the LGL, such as the date of birth and gender of the child, the four-digit post code of the place of residence, information from the medical history questionnaire (with the exception of information on names and addresses), which early detection medicals and vaccinations have been carried out and the results of the school entry medical. Following a plausibility check, the received data is evaluated completely anonymously and published anonymously in the form of a report. The legal basis for the data transmission arises from Article 5 (1) Clause 1 No. 1 GDPR in conjunction with Article 11 SchulgespflV.

5. Your rights

If your personal data and that of your child is processed, you have the right to receive information on the data stored concerning you and your child from the competent public health office (Article 15 GDPR).

If incorrect personal data is processed, you have a right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR). If the statutory conditions are fulfilled, you may demand erasure or restriction of the processing (Articles 17 and 18 GDPR).

6. Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority

You also have the right to lodge a complaint with the Bavarian State Data Protection Commissioner, who you can contact at:
